To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing this letter in support of Dr. Jovana Stojkovic, as I have been informed that a procedure has been initiated to possibly revoke her medical license. I strongly urge you to reconsider her case, as she is among the heroic few medical personnel who are willing to speak out about the dangers of vaccines. To my knowledge, she has never advised anyone not to receive any vaccine, but rather has focused on the issue that people should have the right to choose not to vaccinate if this is their desire.

The United States, where I live, has the highest number of required vaccines of any nation, and we also have an abysmal record in terms of under-five mortality, as well as a large number of children suffering from neurological and autoimmune diseases. Our current epidemic in food allergies is likely caused by reactions to food proteins present as contaminants in vaccines, which are highly allergenic due to aluminum binding. Our autism rate is now one in 59, and I believe that vaccines are an important factor in the ever-increasing prevalence of autism. Studies comparing vaccinated and unvaccinated children are revealing that the vaccinated children are much more susceptible to autoimmune and neurological diseases. The science is by no means settled on the question of the risk/benefit ratio of vaccines. It is only reasonable that people have the right to individually decide, on a case by case basis, whether they or their children should be administered a particular vaccine.

Research currently ongoing at the Corvelva Institute in Italy is revealing that vaccine manufacture is at present a very sloppy process with poor oversight, wherein intended antigens for disease prevention are missing and unintended toxic ingredients are present as contaminants.

I have been informed that the current situation in Serbia is that parents are being punished with high fines if they refuse to vaccinate their children. Parents who don't have money to pay for the fines are receiving a prison sentence, and they get reported to the Center for Social Work due to non-vaccination. This is in my opinion extreme government over-reach.

Personal freedom in health choices is possibly the most important human right that should never be taken away. And there is no question in my mind that a medical doctor should be allowed to express an opinion regarding the issue of mandatory vaccination. If you should revoke Dr. Stojkovic's license, you are sending the wrong message to other doctors who will then be deterred from taking a stance against mandatory vaccination. You will likely find that Serbia's rates of childhood neurological and autoimmune diseases will escalate just as they have in the U.S., as you realize a higher and higher vaccination rate. And you will also provoke even more outrage and unrest among the population of Serbia.

I urge you to take the rational approach of allowing medical professionals such as Dr. Stojkovic to freely speak up about their views regarding the unreasonable policy of mandatory vaccination, without fear of repercussions.
